



# Letter from the Chairman



The opening of the extraordinary Bronx Library Center in January 2006 was certainly the greatest of the many achievements realized by The New York Public Library during the last fiscal year. Central to the Library's mission is service to local communities, and with this new building we are able to reach hundreds of thousands of Bronx residents in a more effective and inspirational way than ever before.

In his President's Letter, Paul LeClerc discusses the success of the Bronx Center and highlights its impact on our thinking about the Library's future. I believe that the success of the Bronx Center also underscores the central role the Board of Trustees plays in the life of The New York Public Library.

In large part, the Board's role is to ensure that the administration's major initiatives meet our long-term strategic objectives, fulfilling our historic mission while also meeting sound financial criteria. Many Trustees, working as individuals or through one of the Board's many active committees, helped the Library's management put together the complex \$50 million funding package for the Bronx Center, which ultimately came together from New York State, New York City, corporations, and individuals. Lead private support came from Trustee Roger Hertog and his wife, Susan. Board members also played crucial roles in the realization of the project, most notably Robert Liberman, Gordon J. Davis, and John H. Banks III, whose hard work proved vitally important. Other notable capital projects included the \$5 million renovation of the magnificent Lionel Pincus and Princess Firyal Map Division in the Humanities and Social Sciences Library. Planning is under way for a major restoration of the exterior of the landmark building on Fifth Avenue.

While the Board provides guidance, expertise, and financial support for the Library, it also works hand-in-hand with its senior managers, which is one of our greatest pleasures. I know I echo the sentiments of the Chairmen Emeriti who serve on the Board – Samuel Butler, Elizabeth Rohatyn, and Marshall Rose – in saying that it is wonderful to work with all our extraordinary staff members, who make this one of the greatest libraries in the world.

As I enter my third year as Chairman, my highest priority is to maintain the outstanding level of Board involvement in

the Library's activities. For more than a century, the Library has been blessed with a Board that represents the best of New York City's philanthropic and cultural communities, and that tradition continues unabated. This year, we were pleased to welcome Raymond J. McGuire to the Board, as well as Lewis B. Cullman, a longtime supporter of the Library, who was elected as a Life Trustee. Three other members were given the honor of Life Trustee this year – John P. Birkelund, Patricia D. Klingenstein, and Toni Morrison. With the election of Christine C. Quinn as leader of the New York City Council, Peter Rider replaced Larian Angelo as the Speaker's representative.

The most important function of the Board is to ensure the financial security of the Library, so that it may fulfill its mission for years to come. We rely on strong annual support from New York City and New York State and from generous individuals, foundations, and corporations, but recent history has shown that we need to continue to build government support for library services. Indeed, we are still working closely with our elected representatives to restore past funding levels from the City, which would allow the Library to return to six days of service, and a minimum of 45 open hours per week, at every location. New Yorkers deserve this level of service from the Library.

With a library system as vast as The New York Public Library – it encompasses 90 facilities – capital improvements are an ongoing concern. This need, coupled with the Board's current emphasis on services to children, led the Director of our Branch Libraries to initiate the systematic renovation of children's rooms in the branches, all funded through private donations. The Starr Foundation led the way by offering a \$2.5 million challenge grant. I am pleased to report that in 2006, six donors made matching commitments, including Felix Rohatyn, in honor of his wife, Elizabeth Rohatyn; the

Picower Foundation; Karen and Kevin Kennedy; Chris Flowers, in honor of his mother, Ann A. Flowers, a librarian; and Lois Collier. My husband, Donald, and I are thrilled to be part of this initiative as well, and we hope that we will be joined by others in this especially worthy cause in the year ahead.


All Board members participated generously in our annual fund, and many individuals provided invaluable leadership for our major fundraising efforts, including our annual Library Lions gala and our Corporate Dinner. Several Trustees made extremely generous commitments to our endowment during FY 2006: Karen and Kevin Kennedy, Dorothy and Lewis B. Cullman, and Mahnaz Ispahani and her husband, Adam Bartos. Their generosity bodes well as we work toward our goal of an endowment that exceeds \$1 billion by 2011, the centennial of the opening of our landmark building on Fifth Avenue. In calendar year 2006, the endowment's value rose from \$616 million to \$708, so we are on our way!

The next year will be pivotal for the Library, as we enter a period of intensive thinking and planning for the future. As technology opens up new ways for knowledge to be shared, all libraries will experience major changes. The New York Public Library will lead the way in defining those changes, and the exceptional commitment of our Trustees will play a vital part in transforming ambitious plans into reality.

# Lefter from the President



# This Library's mission has always been inspired by Thomas Jefferson's simple but noble dictum: "Information is the currency of a democracy."

The Library's staff and I take enormous pride in the ways in which we now render high-quality information services, as well as cultural and educational programs, to local, regional, national, and global audiences. In so doing, we believe that we function as one of the cornerstones of a democratic society, where everyone is provided with free access to the information they seek.

Within our system of 90 facilities covering 130 square miles of New York City, The New York Public Library was able to serve the information needs of 14 million visitors in the last fiscal year. Equally significant, our website — www.nypl.org — also served some 22 million readers who came to the Library electronically from virtually every country and territory on the globe.

The New York Public Library is able to play its role with such success because of several factors. In fiscal 2006, we expanded both the depth of our collections and the reach of our services in a number of notable ways.

Libraries today consist of four basic elements — collections, facilities, staff, and technology — and success in any given year is based on how public service is enhanced through growth or refinements in these critical areas. In the first — collections — the Library added some 220,000 new items to its circulating and research collections, representing an expenditure of more than \$26 million, not including gifts, which also added a great many treasures to our holdings. Pages 30 to 34 of this report describe and illustrate some of the singular materials acquired during fiscal '06, including unusual photographs by Diane Arbus, the archive of Beat Generation writer William Burroughs, and a 1915 autograph letter to William Butler Yeats from Henry James.

Acquiring some of these materials was a result of the sale of art properties in 2005. These sales have added a total of \$54 million in new restricted endowment funds to be used exclusively to support the acquisition of library materials for our research collections. And the return on these new monies permitted us to add \$2.8 million to the annual acquisitions budgets of the research libraries. Moreover, new funding in this area means that the Library will be prepared for extraordinary acquisition opportunities that may arise in future years, thus adding to the brilliance and relevance of our research collections.

From a facilities point of view, the ultimate highlight of fiscal '06 was the success of the superb Bronx Library Center: a 78,000-square-foot, \$50 million new central library for the borough. Paid for with a combination of public and private funds given by the Office of the Governor of New York, the State Assembly, the Office of the Mayor

of New York, the Bronx Borough President, the City Council, and Trustee Roger Hertog and his wife, Susan, this exceptional new facility quickly became one of the most successful new public libraries in America.

Designed by Richard Dattner and Partners and featured on the cover of this Report, the Bronx Library Center is the very first public structure in New York City to win LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) silver certification for being environmentally responsible. In its first year of operation, more than 700,000 readers used the facility, 525,000 items were checked out, and 15,400 new library cards were issued.

Other signature capital projects of fiscal 'o6 include the restoration of the map rooms of the Library at Fifth Avenue, now named by the Trustees The Lionel Pincus and Princess Firyal Map Division as a consequence of a most generous gift; and the renovation of four branch libraries -Great Kills, Columbus, and 67th Street, all of which received City funding, and 115th Street, which was part of our Adopt-A-Branch program and received a matching grant from the Helena Rubinstein Foundation and additional support from the New York State Education Department.

I am especially pleased that the Chief Librarian of the Bronx Library Center, Michael Alvarez, represents one of the great stories of personal success at The New York Public Library. Michael began his career with us in 1984 as a student page, shelving books in a branch library. His exceptional motivation, aided by scholarship support from the Library, led him through college and then to library school while he continued to work in various neighborhood libraries. He then advanced through the managerial ranks of the branch system and ultimately was awarded the responsibility of opening the biggest and most advanced new branch facility in more than a generation.

The lesson to be drawn from Michael Alvarez's story is obvious: the Library, and especially its public, benefit greatly when we invest in nurturing and growing our own talent. This lesson is at the heart of a new staff development program, the Staff Leadership Academy. The program encourages staff members to work in teams to address the daily issues and challenges that beset the Library – out of which have come real solutions in areas such as communication, service, collection development, and staff motivation.

Technology is an intimate and inescapable part of life today, and this Library has consistently embraced technology's power to connect our readers to information resources that are globally dispersed. We have also consistently used the World Wide Web to connect an authentically global audience to the Library via www.nypl.org. The advances we made in this area in fiscal

'06 were substantial and will serve to bring the riches of our collections to millions of readers electronically.

Highlights of the year include signing an agreement with Microsoft to digitize significant portions of the Library's collections that are not covered by copyright protections. This follows the partnership the Library struck with Google last year to digitize separate collections. The Microsoft protocol will result in the digitization of 50,000 books, with a concentration on historical children's literature, whereas the Google agreement involves the large-scale digitization of volumes from our research collections. In each case, the Library's scanned volumes will be available on our website and without charge. An enormously generous \$4 million grant from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, in honor of retiring president William G. Bowen, is helping the Library bridge technology and scholarship.

Another digital innovation launched in fiscal '06 was the addition of music and video to eNYPL, the downloadable media program offered by The Branch Libraries. The site launched in fiscal '05 with eBooks and audio books. The text of a book, audiobook, video, or musical recording can be downloaded to a card holder's computer or hand-held device, where it resides until its due date, at which point it is automatically "returned" to the Library's collections. This year, 9,537 orders were placed for new titles, and 94,513 checkouts were recorded.

The year 2006 also saw the launch of two important outreach efforts, both funded by The Carroll and Milton Petrie Foundation. The first brings students and their teachers into our Research Libraries and encourages them to explore our unmatched primary sources by developing fun and manageable curriculum-related activities. The second promotes early childhood literacy throughout our neighborhood branches, to ensure that children develop the reading and learning skills necessary to enter school ready to succeed.

This wonderful Library's greatness has always been appreciated and underwritten by its funders, both within the public sector – City, State, and federal – and by those in the private sector - individuals, foundations, and corporations. The staff and I happily acknowledge here our very great gratitude to all of those whose financial and moral support sustained us in fiscal 'o6. Information is indeed the currency of a democracy, and with your help we have been able to spread that currency to ever-broader audiences, in both our physical libraries and online.

# **George Arents Collection**



### Financials

### REPORT OF THE TREASURER

The year ending June 30, 2006, was another solid financial year for The New York Public Library. Net assets grew by \$74.9 million, driven by continued strong investment performance, some important new gifts, and sale of some non-core assets. Each of these areas is a vital contributor to the Library's plan to reposition itself over the next several years to meet the significant financial challenges it faces.

The Balance Sheet, page 72, and the Summary of Financial Activities, page 73, are excerpted from the Library's audited financial statements. The complete financial statements, including notes and the unqualified opinion of our auditors,

Ernst & Young LLP, are available upon request.

The Library's two operating units – The Branch Libraries and The Research Libraries – differ not only in their services and collections, but also in their funding sources. While The Branch Libraries receive the bulk (91% in 2006) from government sources, The Research Libraries' funding is more diversified: 48% from government sources, 22% from individuals, corporations, and foundations, and 22% from investment portfolio spending.

### **Library Services and Operations**

Both the Branch and Research Libraries remained open to the public six days a week in many locations despite the combined financial pressures of inflation, new facilities to operate, and a continuing reduction in the Library's endowment spending rate toward a sustainable 5% annual rate.

At June 30, 2006, 35 branch libraries were open six days per week. Restoring all libraries to six days of service, with more hours of operation each day, remains a central objective for the Library. Library management has pressed this case with elected officials, emphasizing the need for New York City's library service to be more in line with that of other major American cities.

Library attendance increased 4.3% to 12.4 million, and circulation increased 2% to 15.9 million. The Library's fastest-growing service – its website – registered a 29% increase to 19 million user sessions.

### **Financial Challenges**

The Library faces dual financial challenges as it plots its future.

First, the Library needs to make substantial investments in new initiatives to transform it into a modern knowledge service provider for its users. Key initiatives include:

- A new central circulating library befitting a world-class city like New York
- Technology spending for content, infrastructure, and service to meet the rapid growth in demand for such services

- Higher levels of spending on collections to restore the Library's collections – for both Branch and Research Libraries – to benchmarks comparable to other leading libraries
- Reinvestment in maintenance on many Library facilities

   deferred in recent years owing to financial constraints –
   to avoid prohibitive emergency repair costs

Second, because the Library's revenue growth has not kept up with inflation for the past several years, it will continue to face a chronic budget gap, or "structural deficit," each year until overall revenue growth increases in line with inflation.

The need to fund important new initiatives while solving a chronic budget shortfall is, of course, quite a conundrum.

### Financial Plan and Outlook

The Library is developing a multiyear financial plan to address these challenges. While the specifics have not been set, some of the major elements are clear:

- New gifts The Library is beginning to contemplate a capital campaign to attract major new resources.
- Sale of assets not critical to mission This past year the Library sold artworks so that the proceeds could be reinvested in collections spending.
- Sustainable growth from investment portfolio Reducing the spending rate on the investment portfolio to 5% should enable the Library to realize sustainable growth from this source for the long term.
- Continued discipline and vigilance regarding expenditures

   This will involve a constant process of finding smarter, more efficient ways to do things.

The Library remains fiscally sound, but prudent management requires us to plan for the future, as we evolve, to assure that we leave a legacy of financial strength for generations to come.

The Library is an organization that is vital to the people of New York City and State, and to the information community worldwide. The City and State governments, Board of Trustees, Library management, and staff remain committed to the extraordinary and historic public-private partnership that has made The New York Public Library one of the world's greatest libraries.

Operating Support and Revenue (\$163,369,000)




FIGURE 2 The Research Libraries and Librarywide Programs: Operating Support and Revenue (\$136,133,000)




FIGURE 3 The Branch Libraries: Operating Expenses (\$156,861,000)





FIGURE 4 The Research Libraries and Librarywide Programs: Operating Expenses (\$146,933,000)



Market Values as of June 30




### RECOMMENDED FORM OF BEQUEST

The New York Public Library is a not-for-profit education corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of New York. The Library is exempt from federal income tax as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is a publicly supported organization under section 170 of the Code.

Gifts and bequests to the Library are deductible under the federal income, estate, and gift tax laws. For federal tax purposes, the Library uses its formal corporate name: The New York Public Library, Astor, Lenox and Tilden Foundations (reflecting its incorporation by the consolidation of the Astor Library, the Lenox Library, and the Tilden Trust). The Trustees of the Library recommend that for estate planning purposes, friends consider the following language for use in their Wills:

"I give and bequeath (dollar amount, percentage of residuary estate, or description of property) to The New York Public Library, Astor, Lenox and Tilden Foundations, Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street, New York, New York 10018, for the Library's general purposes."

If you wish to make a bequest for a specific purpose, it is suggested that you consider adding the following language to any restriction you may impose on your bequest:

"If at any time in the judgment of the Trustees of the Library the designated purpose of this bequest proves to be impracticable or impossible, I authorize the Trustees to use the income and principal of this bequest for any purpose they deem to be consistent with the general intent and purpose set forth herein."

Should you decide to leave a bequest to the Library in your Will, you will become a member of the Bigelow Society. Created by the Library in 1991, the Bigelow Society is an honorary organization whose purpose is to recognize the generosity of individuals, during their lifetime, who include this institution in their estate plans. The Library expresses its gratitude to members by inviting them to special Library events, by listing their names in the Annual Report under the Bigelow Society (see pages 54–58), and by sending them a personalized certificate signed by the President and Chairman of the Library.
