Background

Created in 1895 when the private libraries of John Jacob Astor and James Lenox were consolidated with the Samuel Jones Tilden Trust, The New York Public Library (NYPL) comprises simultaneously a set of scholarly research collections and a network of community libraries. NYPL's intellectual and cultural range is global and attuned to local New York City issues. That combination lends to the Library an extraordinary richness.

The Library is a privately managed, nonprofit corporation with a public mission, operating with both private and public financing in a century-old, still evolving partnership. Catherine

C. Marron serves as Chairman of the Library's Board of Trustees. Dr. Paul LeClerc serves as the Library's President.

The research collections (for reference only, and organized as The Research Libraries, with four major centers) resemble the holdings of the great national and university libraries, with holdings numbering more than 43 million items. The community circulating libraries (organized as The Branch Libraries, with 85 neighborhood branches) offer a wide range of free services, including literacy tutoring, English-language instruction, computer training, and computer access.
